## MICHELE ZUKOVSKY

As the longest-serving female woodwind player in the history of the Los Angeles Philharmonic, Michele Zukovsky has performed worldwide and influenced a generation of clarinetists. She continues to teach at several colleges in California and happily sits down to answer some questions.

What's the best part about being a musician? Getting out of dull family gatherings.

What's the hardest part about being a musician? Practicing.

Who was your hero growing up, and who's your hero today? My father, Kalman Bloch (who was also principal clarinetist of the LA Philharmonic).

Is there a musician/artist that you admire? Artur Schnabel.

#### When you were young, other than music, what did you want to do when you grew up?

I love the idea of curing or saving another person and so I had always wanted to become either a nurse or a doctor. My favorite form of study was paleontology. As an adult, teaching the clarinet was a close second. I asked my dad why he wanted to teach and why he enjoyed it so much, and his answer was "I want to help." We were the same that way.

What worries you about the world? Worries? Ask my cardiologist! What's the first piece of music you remember falling in love with? I fell in love with Prokofiev's 5th Symphony.

What's an unforgettable musical memory? I once came in a measure early in the 3rd movement of Tchaikovsky's 4th Symphony. I can tell you that that was an unforgettable memory, something you never forget!

Do you have a superhuman or fun human trick? I can whistle blowing through my hands.
